### The Vicar writes...

Pancake day has been and gone and we are well into Lent. Lent is traditionally a time for fasting, and like a lot of religious practices it has more than just a spiritual benefit. Fasting is recognised as being good for our health, there are lots of trendy diets that incorporate fasting out there at the moment. The human body has adapted to periods of fast as a natural part of life for when there are things like famine for example, or a really bad day's hunting. At this time of year the larder would be running low which makes it a convenient time for fasting. Fasting can help to increase our awareness, for example, am I eating because I'm hungry or because it's dinner time? #### **Bridestowe Parish Council News**

Pete Daniels has served as clerk and Responsible Financial Officer to Bridestowe Parish Council for 43 years and has just announced he plans to retire. He has always been very diligent and conscientious in carrying out his duties and it is suspected works far more hours than his contract states. He carries out the administration of the council's financial affairs punctiliously. Over the years Pete has supported new Chairs of the Council, helping them to find their feet in their new role. His wealth of experience is invaluable and he will be sorely missed.

## Bridestowe Parish Council is inviting applications for the position of Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer.

Bridestowe Parish Council has 7 councillors who work together in a positive atmosphere to improve the quality of life and wellbeing of their 656 parishioners. The precept for 2024/2025 is £8600.

This is a part-time permanent position of 4.5 hours per week. The salary will depend on experience and qualifications but is anticipated to be between SCP scale 10 to 17 (currently £13.28 to £14.95 per hour).

The Parish Council generally meets on the third Wednesday of every other month. The Parish Clerk is required to produce the agenda for each meeting, attend the meetings in person and record and publish accurate minutes of the proceedings. The Clerk will also be responsible for ensuring the Council conducts its business correctly and will be expected to provide independent and objective advice to councillors. They will be expected to provide the necessary administrative support to allow the Council to function in an effective manner.

As Responsible Financial Officer, the successful applicant will manage the administration of the Council's finances, prepare budgets, track expenditure, produce accounting statements and work with auditors for annual audits.

When not attending the bimonthly council meetings, the clerk will work from home and must have an acceptable internet and telephone connection. You will be expected to be computer literate. A suitable laptop and printer will be provided by the Council.

The Council will be fully supportive of the clerk's career progression and will ensure all necessary training is given, including working towards CiLCA qualification where appropriate.

White Hart Quiz – 13th March, 8pm

This month's quiz is in aid of a brand new charity - **Koalaa Foundation.** 

As some of you will know my daughter, Marina, was born missing both her legs above the knees and her right arm below the elbow. She is now 15, about to ace her GCSE's, and absolutely nothing gets in her way. However upper limb prosthetics have always been a tricky subject, they are heavy, not very functional and she has found them to often hinder rather than help. Until we found **Koalaa!** 

Koalaa was started by a design student who wanted to create a light-weight, comfortable, affordable and functional prosthetic for all. Now a successful start-up company Koalaa

provide prosthetics around the world helping many people with limb differences to achieve their goals.

Since 2020 Koalaa have provided prosthetics for children and young people 18 years and under, living in the UK, completely **FREE** of charge, through **Project Limitless** thanks to a very generous donation.

Marina has received 4 arms over the years, which have helped her to draw, drum, access the gym and achieve a better posture while studying for her upcoming exams – they haven't cost us a penny!!

This project needs to continue so that all children and young people in the UK, and beyond, can easily access a functional prosthetic without it costing them anything......this is where the **Koalaa Foundation** comes in. I have been working with Koalaa to set the charity up with the aim of **providing prosthetics free of charge** to those that need them.

The foundation is currently being registered with the Charities Commission and we are very excited to continue and expand Project Limitless to make sure more young people like Marina get the chance to achieve whatever they want to.

provides locally based support and information to those living with dementia, their family, carers and friends. Memory Cafe runs two bookable meetings on the 2nd & 4th Saturday of each month.

AM session 11.00-12.30 PM session 14.00-15.30

Trained volunteers greet members old & new, after an initial chance to chat over tea & biscuits/cake, carers can join a peer support group in a separate room, to share experiences, exchange information or hear from a guest professional, always in strict confidence. Meanwhile those living with dementia get involved in a variety of stimulating activities supported by our volunteers, quizzes, art & craft, live music, singing & celebratory events are often in the programme.

Care & Share sessions are on the 3rd Thursday of each month providing carers & family a spell of time for themselves for 1-4 hours from 10.30-14.30. Those living with dementia & attending will be involved in a variety of stimulating activities.

Cognitive Stimulation Therapy (CST) is a course of structured theraputic sessions that are based around a topic with talking, music & pictures, all leading to a stimulating, fun & beneficial experience. Run by trained facilitators. The sessions are for an hour, once a week over 12 weeks.

## A Remarkable Lady continued by Howard Barkell

WhenIt may have been that the farm at Bidlake Vean was no longer large enough for her to expand as a pony breeder. There is anecdotal evidence that at some stage she had she planned to build a new home at Glebe Park. For some reason that only got as far as the semi-circular entrance gateway still in existence and the driveway beyond. It may have been that she had made new contacts and friendships during the war years. It may have been to do with her religious persuasion or perhaps she was a restless spirit. For whatever reason in 1922 Bidlake Vean was on the market and she moved to Pearroc Vean at Buckfast.

It is likely that the property belonged to Norah Dawson. She came from a wealthy family who lived at Holne and owned property in the Buckfast area. She also bred ponies and was Sylvia's companion for many years. It had long been recognised that the traditional Dartmoor pony was being replaced on the moor by the ancestors of those we are used to seeing today and some breeders realised that the pedigree might soon be lost. They had been recorded as being on the moor at least since the Middle Ages, thought to have been used as pack horses by the tin miners, and were recognised for their hardiness and usefulness as work horses as well as their single colours, good temperament and usefulness as driving, show and riding ponies. In 1924 the Dartmoor Pony Society was founded to protect the integrity of the breed. Both ladies were probably members of the Society from the beginning. Sylvia became the Honorary Secretary in 1931, a post which she held until 1960 when she resigned over a difference of opinion the direction the Society was taking. Miss Dawson was already the treasurer in 1931, probably until her death in 1945 at the age of 62. After her resignation Sylvia remarked that between them they had just about run the society while in office, especially organising the annual Show at Brimpts. In 1961 she was awarded the British Horse Society's Medal of Honour. Given her work for women during the war it is

not surprising that she took a great interest in

the fledgling Women's Institute movement

which started during the war, the National Federation was formed in 1917. Its initial aims were to encourage women to grow food and preserve where possible for use during the winter. Its later aims were to provide places where all classes of women could meet, learn together and enjoy one another's company. The W.I. was sometimes referred to as Jam and Jerusalem. The latter was William Blake's poem set to music by Hubert Parry in 1916. It was adopted as a battle hymn first by the Suffragette movement and later by the W.I. both with his approval. The Devon Federation was formed in 1920 and it seems that Sylvia was the chairperson from the outset. At the 1921 AGM Emma Retallick, also living at Buckfast, was added to the committee. As chair, Sylvia had already steered through a motion banning any speakers promoting a particular political party and in 1924 she resigned because she felt strongly that working women had no voice in policy or decision making as all the Executive were what

she called 'County' ladies.

In 1934 the two companions bought Little Bidlake from John George Northcott and returned to Bridestowe. They built Cedar House and lived there while continuing to keep Jersey cows and breed ponies. During the Second World War both my parents worked for them part time. My father milked the cows after milking his own. The ladies gave him a Jersey called Juno and an Ayrshire called Rose at different times, very different from his small herd of motley red rubies. My mother made cream and butter from the milk. She had been used to scalding milk over a paraffin stove to make cream at home, but at Little Bidlake there was a milk separating machine which made the process much easier. She probably used a hand whisk to make butter. I remember the mixture in a muslin bag hanging over a bowl in the larder to catch the remaining butter milk as it drained. I still have the butter bats used to shape the butter into blocks, but the decorative stamps pressed into the ends of the butter rolls have succumbed to woodworm.

Frederick Woodgate, a partner in Woodgate Brothers at Tiverton, made a fortune out of puncture repair kits. When the early solid tyres on vehicles were replaced by an inflatable tube inside the tyre

punctures were frequent. Repairs could only be made by a garage equipped to vulcanise the damage. The "world renowned" Patchquick kit was one of the first reliable methods for do-it-yourself repairs. He briefly lived at Millaton and after the war had bought old army huts and had them erected in Tanyard Court as a communal meeting place called The Institute. Before this the only meeting room in the village was at the school. He retained ownership but eventually offered to sell it to the village for £300. At a public meeting in 1938 chaired by Lord Carrington, a later owner of Millaton, it was decided to accept his offer. A couple days later Miss Hamlyn and Miss Dawson offered to buy the premises and extensively repair them before handing them over to the village for recreational and educational purposes. It was actually a rebuild with the community only having to pay for the heating and lighting equipment. It was handed over on 30th November 1938 with responsibility for its management vested in 5 trustees and a committee of villagers representing 12 named village organisations. Many locals trod the boards of the stage in various productions, but by far the most famous performer was the British born, American superstar Bob Hope supported by Frances Langford and others. On 14th July 1943 they entertained both U.S. servicemen and some lucky villagers. In 1942 Little Bidlake was sold to John Down, formerly of Ebsworthy and the two companions returned to Pearroc Vean. My mother and I accompanied them for a few days while they settled in and that was the last time we saw either of them. They continued to breed Dartmoor ponies and sold several to other breeders, including at least one to the U.S.A. It travelled by ocean liner! Prince Charles was also presented with one soon after his birth.

I still have a handful of greetings cards from them, always a postcard, usually of Dartmoor ponies, sometimes railway engines, always signed S C H. She could not understand why I preferred engines to ponies. I think she was justly proud to be presented to the Queen when the Royal Show was held at Newton Abbot in 1952. She sent us a fully mounted photograph of her chatting to the Queen while holding a rosette adorned Dartmoor

mare with suckling foal at foot.

After her death at Paignton District Hospital on 10th June 1962 it was rumoured that the considerable fortune that she inherited from Norah Dawson ended up at Buckfast Abbey.

## **Movie Watch - February 2024**

I'm breaking with tradition this month. Every February, having meticulously researched the runners and riders, I've dutifully given you my idea of the Best Picture winner at the forthcoming Academy Awards ceremony (this year to be held on 10th March). Then, just as predictably, every March I sheepishly admit that my selection finished hopelessly tailed off, way behind the winner.

But this year things will be different. I'll still give you my choice but this time it will sweep the board. That film, of course, is **Oppenheimer** which surely will not be beaten.

Having said that, last year appeared to be a fight between **The Fabelmans**, Top Gun: Maverick and my choice, **The Banshees of Inisherin**, only for an unconsidered (and seriously weird) film, Everything Everywhere All at Once to come with a late run and beat them all.

That one told the story of a middle-aged, permanently bewildered, Chinese immigrant who, along with her husband, runs an American launderette where she attempts to connect different versions of herself in a parallel universe. At least I think it did.

This year's contenders don't appear to include anything of that ilk, leaving a series of well-made, fairly conventional titles although, having said that, Barbie has also been nominated although she seems unlikely to trouble the judges to any great extent.

You may recall that we chickened out of watching **Oppenheimer** when it appeared at the New Carlton, on the admittedly flimsy basis that, with a running time of more than three hours, it was just too long. However we duly rented the film on Amazon Prime, to view in the comfort of our own home, with lavatory and drinks breaks as required. It is, needless to say, an exceptional piece of work, well worth the £4-99 rental price.

Billed as a biographical thriller based almost entirely around the subject, ('the father of the

atomic bomb'), the film features a superb cast. Alongside the Best Film accolade, Cillian Murphy may well be voted Best Actor, while Robert Downey Jr, in a welcome return to top form, looks a certainty to collect Best Supporting Actor honours. Christopher Nolan will presumably win Best Director in what, to be honest, looks something of a non-vintage year.

The Guardian made **Oppenheimer** 'the ultimate monster movie' with the subject 'an atomic-age Frankenstein, a man captivated by the endless possibilities of science, realising too late that his creation has a limitless capacity for destruction.'

It's certainly not entertaining and it's not particularly enjoyable, but this is a significant film which, despite the running time, never dragged. Recommended with confidence.

Our only February cinema visit was to see **Argylle** and we quickly wished we hadn't bothered. A puerile spy action comedy, directed and produced by Matthew Vaughn, one of the broadsheets described it, not unreasonably, as 'a colossal, cumbersome dud.'

This is another of those films proudly boasting an ensemble cast, enabling the distributors to bill the likes of Bryan Cranston and Samuel L Jackson alongside a reluctant-looking Bryce Dallas Howard and Sam Rockwell. Quite why Dua Lipa allowed herself to get dragged in is a mystery. I'd suggest you put a line through this one.

However we do have some interesting titles headed our way. **Oppenheimer** will no doubt be granted additional showings at the New Carlton, but disappointing early reviews of **Wicked Little Letters** (Olivia Colman, Jessie Buckley, Timothy Spall) suggest a film that fails to do justice to a terrific cast. That one opened locally at the end of February but may not run long into March if the critics have their way.

The same comment applies to **Madame Web**, another big budget Marvel Comics piece, this time starring Dakota

Johnson. A more positive reception has greeted **Bob Marley: One Love**, a film produced in partnership with the Marley family and celebrating the life and music of a much loved and iconic figure.

**Dune: Part Two** is scheduled to reach Okehampton on 1st March. The next chapter of Frank Herbert's novel, this one will require advance booking. Otherwise, we'll just have to wait until the Oscar winners are announced and the schedules amended accordingly.

As ever when the weather is bad, television options become pretty good. Much TV talk recently seems to have centred on **One Day**, the Netflix drama series based on the bestselling book by David Nicholls. This one is based around two young people who meet on their Graduation Day at Edinburgh in 1988 and spend the next 20 years as best friends, narrowly missing becoming a couple. As I write, we've only watched the first four episodes so I can't give a considered opinion, but it's been very positively reviewed and already rattles along at a nice pace.

The lead roles are filled by Leo Woodall, last seen in **The White Lotus**, and Ambika Mod who played the junior doctor in **This Is Going To Hurt**. It would appear to be an easy watch, with 14 episodes of roughly half an hour each. Well worth a try.

lf One Day looks an easy watch, Breathtaking (ITV) emphatically doesn't. A drama set in a Covid ward and shown over three consecutive nights, this is tough viewing. Based on a memoir by a real doctor, Rachel Clarke, you will be enraged by the lack of equipment. The main doctor featured (Joanne informed there Froggatt) was sufficient powered respirator masks to go around, but that she could buy one herself on Amazon for £300.

As ever, plenty of recommendations from all sorts of people, for which many thanks.

**The Durrells** has been on Netflix for some time now but still earns a strong recommendation. Four seasons with between six and eight episodes in each. Comfortable

wet Sunday afternoon viewing, I'm reliably informed.

**Decline and Fall** (Netflix) also comes highly recommended. Three one-hour episodes telling the story of a Divinity student expelled from Oxford due to a misjudged prank. An excellent cast including Jack Whitehall, Eva Longoria and David Suchet.



As a deaf person Deb will speak of the important role Elmo plays in her life and has done for the last 8 years. Probus Clubs were formed in the United Kingdom in 1965. The Probus movement had its beginnings in two community-based social clubs, both created by members of Rotary at Welwyn Garden City who were mostly excommuters. The original description of Probus was that "A Probus club is a local association of retired and semi-retired professional and business people, and others who have had some measure of responsibility in any field of worthy endeavor, who are of character and respected in their communities." That sounds a bit dated now, but it gives some idea of what we are about!

In 1974 Probus expanded into New Zealand and by 1976 the idea had spread to Australia. Although Probus membership has its greatest concentrations in Great Britain, Australia and New Zealand, around 4,000 clubs today exist in all parts of the world.



## THE FIRST CORNISHMAN TO CLIMB EVEREST By Ed Buckingham

#### Monday 4th March at 2pm



Ed Buckingham was born and raised in Cornwall, where he still lives today. He is the first Cornishman to climb the highest summit on each of the world's seven continents and the first postman to achieve this amazing feat. Rightly proud of his mountaineering achievements as of working for over thirty-four years for the Royal Mail. He was awarded the Cornish Gorsedh award for Exceptional Endeavour in 2013 in recognition of being the first person to raise the St Piran's Cornish flag on the summit of Everest. He is the author of two books titled, '7 Summits' and 'Toby Goes Extreme In Antarctica.'

After seeing a newspaper article when he was recovering from a football injury, Ed was inspired to start climbing. His first climb was Mount Kilimanjaro and since then has completed the Seven Summits, including Everest, a world mountaineering challenge. Hear how Ed used 5 bottles of oxygen in total and spent nine hours from camp three to the peak of Everest. He passed eight preserved bodies of previous climbers on the way down who had not

made it. "You're already aware of the risks you take but you just think "I just hope that doesn't happen to me", he said.

### News from Lydford Gorge National Trust Rose Cooke, Visitor Experience Officer

#### **Update on the walking routes for 2024**

We've had to take proactive action against the effects of climate change at Lydford Gorge. A new operating model will start from Saturday 16 March with two feature trails, the Devil's Cauldron trail and the Waterfall trail, available for visitors.

The higher path through the woodland, that links the Devil's Cauldron entrance and Waterfall entrance (renamed the Lyd link), and the path to Tucker's Pool will open as two-way routes during quieter times. This is mainly due to the narrowness of the paths and means that these routes will currently be closed during bank holidays and school holidays.

This new operating model means that we've had to make the tough decision to close the river path. It has required increasing costly interventions, in both time and money, to open safely to visitors each year. Plus, the river path has recently suffered several significant landslips due to changes in climate and more extreme weather patterns. Extended periods of drought and heavy rain have taken a toll on the thin soils and steep slopes in the gorge. We will continue to look after Lydford Gorge and maintain access to as much of it as possible. However, we must adapt to the changing climate, and this decision is one that was not taken lightly. We look forward to welcoming everyone to the gorge when we reopen.






