# Okehampton Artillery Camp by Howard Barkell

The sight of a red flag fluttering in the wind at the top of a tor or the staccato chattering of small arms fire are reminders that the Military have used the moor for practice for decades. As the development of weapons gathered pace their range increased and large open spaces like Dartmoor were needed to replace previous ranges which were no longer suitable. To begin with rifle ranges were used by the local militia. Artillery practice had usually taken place by firing out to sea but that was no longer practicable. The War Department chose Dartmoor as a possible replacement. After a successful trial and with the agreement of the Duchy of Cornwall who owned most of the land and the encouragement of the Okehampton Town Council who saw the chance of extra trade for local businesses a 25 year lease was signed with Rev. Luxmoore in 1875 to use part of his Okehampton Park estate as a temporary annual campsite. In September a detatchment of the Royal Artillery from Devonport made the two day journey to Okehampton and lived in a tented camp for three weeks while firing in an area between the Taw and East Okement. By 1880 the camp was pitched for firing to start in early June and finish in late August. At any one time three batteries were in residence.

The camp size had increased to over 100 bell tents and marquees for over 350 officers and other ranks and 256 horses were picketed between the harness tents and the main camp. Batteries now travelled from far and wide for their annual three week practice. A detachment from Canterbury was on the road for a fortnight before it reached Okehampton. Three ranges were in use and each Battery was programmed to fire over 500 rounds, some impact shells, some shrapnel which were fused to explode close to the ground and a few case shot for use against infantry and cavalry. There was no firing at weekends, although Saturdays could be used if weekdays had been lost because of bad weather.

The public was warned when firing was taking place by flying a red flag on Yes Tor. Other flags were raised at Watchet Hill above Belstone and at Fitz's Well on the approach to the camp. If firing was to take place on a

Saturday, notices were sent to local post offices for public display on Friday afternoon, including those at Bridestowe and Lydford. In 1886 the Duke of Cambridge, the Commander in Chief of the Forces, made a special journey from London by train to watch the new 12 pounder gun being fired. He was met by a mounted party at Okehampton station and proceeded to Halstock Hill, but the weather was so bad that firing was cancelled. The Duke, as his cousin Queen Victoria is supposed to have said, was not amused, cut short his visit and caught the next LSWR train back to London.

Public safety did not seem to be a huge priority. Indeed, excursions and visits to watch the whole spectacle of firing were encouraged. It must have been quite a sight to see each team of six horses with three mounted drivers pulling the limber or gun carriage and gun across the river from the camp followed by the 5man mounted gun team then up the hill towards Halstock Hill where the guns were detached and made ready for firing. A national newspaper report in 1892 told of how three visitors to the area decided to walk from Gidleigh to Cranmere Pool. Presumably unversed in military matters they could hear gunfire and eventually see shells exploding on a distant hillside but still carried on until they reached their goal. By the time they were having their lunch the firing had stopped, but when it restarted they could hear the shells coming and see them pass overhead and explode nearby. They managed to crawl along one of those deep fissures in the peat until they reached the Taw valley and safety. They complained afterwards that there were no red flags or warning signs on that side of the moor. Following this bad publicity several extra flag poles were erected including those on Kitty Tor and Sourton Tor and notice boards warning of the dangers erected.

After battling the Dartmoor wind, mist and rain under canvas for several years it was decided to make Okehampton a permanent camp. In 1892 the War Department signed a 999 year lease with Marion Luxmoore and others for 93 acres of the Okehampton Park Estate at a yearly rent of £152. The area was marked by 8 boundary posts consisting of granite blocks marked in a similar way to those around Willsworthy, the letters WD

with one of the numbers 1 to 8 underneath. For the next two years a number of buildings were erected including stables, tack rooms, feedstores and a farrier's shop. Officers and their servants were provided with accommodation, other ranks still slept on straw filled palliasses in bell tents! Further improvements were provided over the years until we have the present camp as it is today. Townspeople got used to seeing convoys of horses and guns passing through the town on their way to the camp. They got a surprise in 1882 when the detachment from Devonport arrived from their halfway stop at Tavistock. Behind the horses came a string of Spanish mules each carrying part of a gun, 7 mules per gun. They were part of a mountain battery and had found mules to be an asset in the mountainous Afghan campaign.

My grandfather served in the RHA for 23 years, for several years as a Driver. He was responsible for two horses and their harness. This included feeding and grooming as well as keeping the leather harness polished. In a team of three pairs the drivers rode on the left hand horse and they were known as the lead, centre and wheel drivers. He came to Okehampton at least once when he was stationed at Aldershot but didn't have the privilege of riding through the town. In the 1890's the LSWR built a special military siding just this side of the station. Special trains loaded with soldiers, horses, guns and other equipment could unload there. A special exit was made onto camp road for easier access across the bridge and up the hill to the camp. This saved the long journeys previously made by road. The site is now occupied by the Army Cadet Force and the beginning of the Granite Way runs right beside it.

One group of people who didn't welcome the likelihood of more live firing and the area of ranges being extended were the commoners whose animals had to be cleared from the ranges when live firing took place. In 1893 the Commoners of Bridestowe and Sourton were offered £50 every 31st December for loss of pasture on certain parts of the common on firing days. A heated meeting in Bridestowe schoolroom followed because Sourton wanted the whole £50 because their farmers would be most inconvenienced, but the commons are actually held jointly. It was eventually agreed to

accept the War Office's offer and to appoint Frank Ward, a well respected auctioneer and surveyor from Brentor owning the firm of Ward & Chowen, as arbitrator between the two sets of commoners. They had to find their own range clearer. A similar situation occurred between Okehampton Borough and the Hamlets, but they were paid £200 as the acreage lost was much larger. Local commoners are still paid compensation every year. Some of them make generous donations to worthy parish causes or events.

#### A Hundred Years Ago

Thanks to Carl I believe there was an article in a recent edition of the Cornish and Devon Post recounting how electricity came to Bridestowe a hundred years ago. John Worden, a local carpenter and undertaker, was responsible. He owned the Sawmills on Rectory Road (Pig's Leg, that is the piece at the Sourton end, was never mentioned). He lived and farmed at Diggaport. The sawmill was a long, low corrugated iron building where the circular saw was capable of sawing quite large tree trunks into planks and coffin boards. The power came from a waterwheel attached to the bench by a belt. The water was brought by leat from the river from just opposite Leawood Mill. He installed a series of storage batteries which were connected to a generator worked by the waterwheel (its remains can be seen in the car park of the Highwayman Inn). The electricity was mainly for John's own use and a series of poles carried the power line to Diggaport. There were also a few street lights dotted around the village. When the wheel was turning it made an audible, distinctive noise, but it had to be turned off promptly at ten o'clock in the evening!

A summary of the feedback from the public consultation held on 26th March provided by Mark Edwards Head of Development

"44 people attended the public exhibition held at the Ark on 26th February 2025 from 2pm to 7.30pm at which they were able to view a series of panels covering feedback from the drop-in session in Oct'24, policy details from the Bridestowe & Sourton Neighbourhood Development Plan, information on local housing need, site constraints, sustainability and drainage, as well as the proposed final layout and examples of house types and finishes.

The panels were posted on the Bakers Estates dedicated consultation portal (bakerestatesconsultation.co.uk) the day after the public exhibition. They could be viewed and/or downloaded and an online feedback form was available to complete. Following the public exhibition, feedback forms (available in hard copy at the event or online) were required to be completed and returned by 5th March.

The material on display demonstrated how the plans had evolved in response to feedback, and how matters rated as important by the community, such as parking and affordable housing, had been prioritised. The feedback from this second event was overwhelmingly positive."

#### 'Souper' Thursday

Well it **was** super. The event was funded by a grant that Bridestowe Parish Council had received and was specifically for 'Warm Spaces' events. It was an enjoyable three hours with people coming together to enjoy a choice of soups, crusty bread, various cheeses and fruit and it offered a chance to have a good natter. It was informal and friendly. In fact it went so well it was suggested that another similar event is held in the autumn. It was a proper community event. #### **Movie Watch March 2025**

I was ready to lead this month with a few words on **The Salt Path**, full of local interest and originally scheduled for general release at the end of April. However we learn the launch date has just been pushed back until 30th May, despite the finished film having been shown at the Toronto Film Festival back in September 2024.

The delay is a shame as I suspect many of you will already have read Raynor Winn's 2018 memoir, on which the film is based. In short, a married couple run into legal problems relating to the ownership of their home, at the same time the husband receives a bleak medical diagnosis. Homeless, penniless and hopelessly unprepared, they decide to walk the 630-mile South West Coast Path, pretty much on a whim, from Minehead to Poole.

It's a terrific story, beautifully crafted by a first-time author. The Guardian described it as, 'Funny, sometimes uplifting,' while the book collected numerous awards and became a Sunday Times best seller. The film adaptation stars Gillian Anderson and Jason Isaacs. No doubt the launch will be backed by significant promotional support.

We'll return to **The Salt Path** when the film has been reviewed and distribution details made available. Hopefully it will reach Okehampton within a few days of the national release date. It already appears on the Coming Soon pages of the New Carlton website.

During the post-Oscar lull, film distributors tend to sit on their hands. (I'm sure they do no such thing, but that's how it appears). They did provide us with a brief opportunity to catch **The Brutalist**, for which Adrien Brody was voted Best Actor, but at a bottom-numbing 215 minutes run time, a film would need to cover a more obviously compelling subject than a Hungarian-Jewish Holocaust survivor arriving in the US in search of the Great American Dream.

Best Picture honours went to **Anora**, with Mikey Maddison voted Best Actress, while the Best Supporting awards went to Zoe Saldana for her performance in **Emilio Perez** and

Keiran Culkin for **A Real Pain.** The former, incidentally, is described as a Spanish language French musical crime film, a genre upon which I'd not previously stumbled.

A few nominated titles had at least reached Okehampton but sadly **A Complete Unknown** and **Conclave**, both excellent we thought, failed to trouble the judges.

That Coming Soon page generally looks weak, with a few possible exceptions. **Bridget Jones:** Mad About the Boy continues to be granted occasional local showings, while Black Bag (Cate Blanchett, Michael Fassbender and Pierce Brosnan) is a positively-reviewed spy drama.

I don't think I'd make much of an effort to see **Death of a Unicorn**, despite the presence of Richard E Grant in the credits, but **The Amateur**, starring Rami Malek and released on 11th April, could be anything. Charlie Heller is a brilliant, but deeply introverted CIA decoder working out of a basement office at headquarters in Langley. His life is turned upside down when his wife is killed in a London terrorist attack. His supervisors refuse to get involved so he takes matters into his own hands. Could be worth a check.

The big cinema title of the summer will no doubt be **Mission: Impossible - The Final Reckoning**, with Tom Cruise starring in what will be the eighth (and possibly final) instalment of the franchise. Scheduled for release during May.

Meanwhile the evenings are starting to draw out, making television a progressively less appealing proposition. Nevertheless I've scribbled down a few noteworthy titles.

Our March favourite, by some distance, has been the first season of the outrageous **Bad Sisters** on Apple TV+ for which we're squeezing the last drops of our free threemonth trial subscription. By the way, that's an offer worth exploring should you ever need to replace an Apple phone, laptop, iPad or whatever.

However, I specify Season One

as the reviews suggest the second season has been nothing like as enjoyable as the first, but we've not yet got there. Regardless of that, the first season has been a delight. Set in and around Dublin, Bad Sisters is a very black Irish comedy created by, and starring, the excellent Sharon Horgan. Recommended viewing, although the jury must remain out on Series 2.

Not strictly speaking a programme recommendation, but do you ever flick on Sky News during weekdays mornings? Their rolling morning news show is billed as **Sky News Today with Wilfred Frost** and runs from 10am. Wilfred is David Frost's 39-year-old son and has clearly inherited his father's fluency and incisive interviewing technique. I can't think of a more impressive TV Current Affairs presenter. In fact he looks to me like a Dimbleby-in-Waiting.

So, what else? **With Love, Meaghan** is an American Lifestyle TV series, featuring the Duchess of Sussex and a few chums. I had a look at it, mostly to save you the bother, It launched on Netflix at the start of March. The Duke and Duchess signed a private rights deal worth an estimated £100m. It looked unspeakably dreadful to me, but then I'm not exactly part of the target audience. If you're tempted, I should give it a. try.

Jumping from the sublime to the faintly ridiculous, **The Dimbleby Lectures** were this

year given by the former England Football Manager, Sir Gareth Southgate. I liked and admired Gareth which I'm fairly sure will sadly have left me in a small minority amongst the football fraternity.

A few others, from various sources. **Feat** (Amazon Prime) is a well-reviewed three-part psychological thriller, described as 'an extraordinarily creepy thriller.' **A Cruel Love - The Ruth Ellis Story** tells the tragic story of the last woman to be hanged in Britain. That one stars Lucy Boynton alongside the invariably excellent Toby Jones.

**Protection** (ITV1) follows the gripping story of a Witness Protection Officer told in six parts. Towards Zero is available on the BBC iPlayer and has been Positively reviewed.

Adolescence and Black Doves are Netflix thrillers, while Small Town, Big Story stars Christina Hendricks from the outstanding Mad Men, together with the Irish comedian Chris O'Dowd.

**White Lotus** continues on Sky, attracting a large and appreciative audience, but mostly I will just continue to point you in the direction of the wonderful **Slow Horses** on Apple TV+



### News from Lydford Gorge National Trust

#### **Rose Cooke, Visitor Experience Officer**

You will most likely have heard about the mudslide that happened two days before we were due to open at the start of March. It happened after heavy rain when debris fell from the steep bank onto the narrow steps leading to the viewing platform in the Devil's

Cauldron. As I write this, the work to make it safe is planned and we're hoping to be open by April if all goes well. You never know what the gorge is going to throw at you next.



While researching a moss I spotted on Dartmoor, for a social media post, I learnt about the fascinating 'splash-cup dispersal mechanism'. The bristly haircap moss Polytrichum piliferum, looks like it has little red flowers, but they aren't flowers and are far more interesting. The mosses are either male or female and the red cups are modified leaves which are found on male plants in spring and summer. They produce the plant's sperm which is dispersed by raindrops hitting the red cups and splashing off, hopefully transferring the sperm to a female moss nearby and fertilising it. Hence why it's called the splashcup dispersal mechanism - there is always something new to learn in nature.

### An improved bus service

There is a strong desire within the village to have a bus service that really serves the community. This letter, written by local residents, was forwarded by the Parish Council to the transport team at Devon County Council and to the relevant bus companies.

'As you will be aware Bridestowe is a sizeable village located to the south of the former A30. Current residential planning proposals will add well over 100 extra residents in the near future. Unfortunately, our bus services have been allowed to severely decline over the years to the extent that not a single service bus route now comes into the village. This situation is causing difficulties for young and old alike. For example, older residents are being forced to use taxis at a cost of £30 plus per round trip to Okehampton and younger people face extreme challenges in accessing desired educational courses, especially those run by Exeter College which is the nearest provider of vocational options. Whilst it is true that the Go Cornwall bus 306 does stop on the old A30 outside the village this is of only very limited use for the following reasons:

There are just 4 daily journeys possible to Okehampton. Of those, one arrives in Okehampton at 7.10 a.m. well before the shops and other facilities are even open. The latest arrives at 18.10 after most shops/facilities have shut and provides no realistic option to return. The other two options both necessitate a stay of over 4 hours in Okehampton

The nearest bus stop to Bridestowe village for passengers wishing to travel to Okehampton involves walking up a steep hill and crossing a busy road which is not speed restricted.

The bus stop does not even have a shelter.
The 306 does not serve Tavistock
A number of excuses have previously been put forward as to why the village cannot be provided with a reasonable bus service.
These seem to focus on the perceived inadequacy of the existing bus turning bay

located in the centre of the village and issues of congestion. Whilst it is accepted that the current turning bay arrangement may not be ideal there would seem to be ample scope to improve it. The congestion argument is simply not accepted at all as the village roads are frequently used by all manner of HGVs and massive agricultural machinery. It is also notable that the daily school bus, a large coach, travels the full length of the village shortly after 8 a.m. (when residents parking is near its peak level) and again in the early evening. Other service buses, including the 118, successfully negotiate routes along narrower roads. The Parish Council would like to put forward a suggestion which would meet the local need at minimal cost. That is to re-route alternate 118 bus services so that instead of all those buses passing straight along the A386 through Sourton half would instead serve Bridestowe and Trescote Way as follows:

Towards Okehampton -From A386 turn left at the Fox and Hounds – Continue along Station Road into Bridestowe village stopping at the White Hart or nearby-Continue through Bridestowe turning right onto the former A30 opposite Bridestowe garage- Stop at the Trescote Way bus stop then travel onward to the Sourton junction to re-join the current 118 route.

Towards Tavistock as above but in reverse. This option would still leave the residents of the small village of Sourton with a 2 hourly service and would not adversely affect any other current users of the 118. It would have positive benefits for a far greater number of people, not only in Bridestowe but also Trescote Way (Sourton Parish). Since no bus turning would be required the

Since no bus turning would be required the cost of such a change would surely be limited and, as a planning application for a new residential development is expected shortly, presumably there must be some scope for attracting a developer contribution.

We sincerely hope for a positive response.'
