The Vicar writes...

In the church calendar we have just celebrated Rogation, when we ask for God's blessing on the land. The Bible is optimistic about the earth; it is a gift from God for our use. These days most people are pessimistic about the future; they think the future for humanity and the natural world is getting worse. We have a tendency to raise our threshold for success as we make progress. To quote Harvard psychologist Daniel Gilbert, "When problems become rare, we count more things as problems...when the world gets better, we become harsher critics of it and this can cause us to mistakenly conclude that it actually hasn't got better at all."

If you learn about the world through the BBC and social media, you have probably missed the greatest stories of our time. Here's a few snippets from a recently published book: "Ten Global Trends and many others you will find interesting" Bailey and Tupy.

As late as 1820, nearly 84% of the world's population lived in extreme poverty (roughly on less then £1.90 per person per day) by 2018 that number had fallen to 8.6%. Humanity has not yet run out of a single

supposedly non-renewable resource.
Predictions that world oil reserves were about to peak and begin declining have proved wrong. While oil production has increased, global oil reserves have tripled since 1970.
World population will likely peak at about 8.9 billion by 2060 and decline to 7.8 billion by the end of the 21st century.

Agricultural productivity has greatly improved so that now famines have all but disappeared outside of war zones. Since 1961, the global average population food supply per person per day rose from 2196 calories to 2962 calories in 2017. (A moderately active adult man requires about 2200-2800 per day). The greatest famine of all time occurred between 1958 and 1962 when the Chinese communists used brute force to nationalize the country's farmland, causing 45 million deaths. Today the world's poorest region enjoys access to food that is roughly equivalent to that of the Portuguese in the 1960's.

In the Roman Empire farmers grew about 540kg wheat per hectare. In the UK in 2018

farmers harvested about 8 tons per Ha. More than 50% of our daily calorific intake comes directly from cereal grain consumption (20% wheat and 21% rice)

To light the night our ancestors burned wood and later vegetable fats and tallow, lamps fuelled by coal gas and kerosene until electric lighting arrived at the end of the 19th century. A candle produces about 0.1 lumens of light whereas a fluorescent bulb produces 68 lumens. Our stone age ancestors would have laboured 58 hours, mostly by gathering wood, to 'buy' 1000 lumens of light. Today 1000 lumens requires 0.0001 hours of human labour – a reduction of close to 100%. Only 12% of the world's freshwater use is for household use, 69% is used in agriculture and 19% in industry. Water use costs money and therefore it is in the interest of water intensive industries to limit water use. Israel is one of the driest places on earth and yet they export agricultural produce including watermelons. They have developed innovative water treatment systems, which recapture 86% of the water that goes down the drain and reuse it for irrigation. The second most efficient country in the world is Spain which recycles around 19%. Another Israeli innovation is in desalination making fresh water consumed by Israeli households 48% cheaper than that consumed by the people of Los Angeles.

Forests are expanding, the global tree canopy increased by 865,000 square miles between 1982 and 2016. And finally, from Psalm 24 "The earth is the Lord's, and all that is in it."

A Royal Visit by Howard Barkell

In 1909 it had been had been arranged for the Prince and Princess of Wales to visit Devon and Cornwall in their role as Duke and Duchess of Cornwall. On 8th June they boarded the Royal Coach at Waterloo Station and at 10.45 left on the journey to the West Country. The train was a normal London and South Western Railway express to Plymouth, but the Royal Couple were not going to travel quite that far. At 2.45 p.m. the sage green locomotive pulled up on the down platform at Bridestowe Station near milepost 204. It wasn't a T9 'Greyhound' as might have been expected, but number 174, another Dugald Drummond design, a 4-4-0 L11 built at Nine Elms in 1906. It survived right through the Southern Railway period before being scrapped in 1951 when in British Railways ownership.

After a bit of manoeuvring it shunted its train back onto the up line and stopped so that the Royal Coach was opposite the station buildings. It was a beautiful sunny afternoon and the station had been decorated with red, white and blue bunting and shields showing the Prince of Wales feathers. The approach to the station was draped with flags and festoons. Red carpet had been laid on the platform as far as the station entrance. Awaiting the royal train crowds of local people were supervised by a large police presence, but were kept off the station premises. The station entrance was lined by boys of the Kelly College Cadet Corps. After alighting from the carriage the Duke and Duchess, as they were known during the Duchy Tour, were welcomed by Earl Fortesque, the Lord Lieutenant of Devon and were introduced to Mr. Barrington, the Duchy Steward at Princetown. Also on the platform were other members of the royal party and the Calmady-Hamlyn family from Leawood. Two royal cars were waiting to take them on the next stage of their journey, both bearing the Prince of Wales crest. The back- up was a Daimler with a chauffeur and mechanic. Princess Mary, followed by Prince George, stepped into a new car recently delivered from the factory, a Sheffield Simplex.

They proceeded down the road towards Bridestowe where the village was decorated, the church bells were ringing and the crowd was waiting expectantly. On the granite-built arch of West Bridge the pupils of Bridestowe School were wearing their Sunday best, the girls wearing red, white and blue sashes and the boys waving flags. When the cars stopped at the sharp left turn onto the A30 the children started singing God Bless the Prince of Wales, under the stern eye of the headmaster, Tom Sly.

As the cars headed towards their first stop at Launceston, to be followed by further engagements at Bodmin and Newquay before the day was over, the villagers made their way to the Sporting Green where a splendid tea had been prepared followed by sports. This despite the fact that several of them had already Beast the Bounds earlier in the morning.

So ended the brief Royal Visit, believed to be the first since Charles I was supposed to have passed through the village.



Bridestowe Village Hall Chairperson's Report

The past twelve months have been another busy and successful period for the Village Hall. The Village Hall Trustees and Committee members continue to meet monthly to discuss the smooth running of the Hall and discuss the programme of improvements and maintenance to keep things in as good an order as possible as funds and time allow.

Firstly I would like to thank all the Trustees for their ongoing commitment to keeping the Hall running effectively.

The current team has continued to commit time and energy to run this important community facility. Much of the work and time commitment provides a very meaningful contribution to Community life in the village and I am sure that everyone (particularly former Trustees and Committee members) appreciate the support that they continue to give on a completely voluntary basis. I would also like to thank Committee members and volunteers who help to keep the Hall going and in particular Terry Pritchard for continuing to be chief cook at bacon baps and Ali Young for making sure the Hall is ready and supplies are in as well as overseeing the session. Thank you too to Debbie Pritchard and the other volunteers who support this event. Another big thank you goes to the regular Hirer's of the Hall whose continued support has ensured that we can continue to keep things going and provide the all-important income stream. In addition the Hall has had a record number of wedding parties in 2024 and going into 2025 which makes a huge difference to cash flow which helps to keep the Hall in good order and also means we have been able to

In 2024 some of the money raised was used towards the kitchen refurbishment and a very useful glass washer was added to the bar in the Margaret Moore Suite. The bar area was further enhanced by the bar itself being stripped down and revarnished. Some new windows were also fitted at Treetops. Also the heating system needed a complete overhaul and this alone cost c £3,000

hold our hire charges unchanged for the third

year running.

In the last twelve months a defibrillator has been fitted on the outside wall between the entrance to the Main Hall and the Treetops entrance. This was funded by a very generous anonymous donation plus additional monies from both the Village Hall and Treetops. The fire alarm panel has been replaced, at a cost of c £500 and is now working smoothly. The sewerage system has had a complete overhaul – sadly wet wipes being flushed down the toilets had caused the mechanics to jam so the whole system had to be lifted, away for cleaning and refitted. This cost an additional c £500

The stage curtains were finally altered – these had been a bit of an eyesore for a number of years – and now look very smart indeed – this drew many compliments from hirers and other users – and has certainly enhanced the overall ambiance of the main hall.

The Hall Floor is still in need of a complete overhaul at some point but given the cost (c £30,000) it has been decided to keep the old floor going for as long as possible. The cost of this has to be borne in mind but it was agreed at the last meeting to replace the flooring in the entrance lobby and the Margaret Moore Suite at a cost of some £5,000 and this work will now go ahead.

The Hall was also revalued for insurance purposes and unsurprisingly it was found that the insurance was inadequate in these days of rising prices. A valuer from the insurance company came to the Hall and estimated what a rebuild would cost and this has resulted in an increase in the annual premium but it was agreed it was essential to have proper insurance in place.

It was decided that owing to dwindling numbers the 59 Lottery Club (a monthly lottery to help raise funds for the Hall) would be disbanded at the renewal date of April 2025. We would like to thank everyone who supported this initiative over the years.

Most of the existing Trustees have now been supporting the Hall for over seven years so we would really love to welcome some new members. Any contribution, no matter how small would be welcome as there are often odd jobs or simple tasks that need to be done so do please consider being either a volunteer or a Trustee. If you are interested why not come along to one of our meetings – we would be delighted to have you join our team.

Flower of the month...Yellow Rattle *Rhinanthus minor* An annual about 30-50cm tall with simple or branched stems bearing narrowly lance-shaped, nettle-like dark green leaves and tubular, 2-lipped yellow flowers. It flowers May to September.

When the flowers of yellow-rattle fade, the brown calyxes (containing the sepals) in which the tiny seeds ripen can be seen and heard - they give a distinctive 'rattle', hence the common name.

Yellow-rattle thrives in grasslands, living a semi-parasitic life by feeding off the nutrients in the roots of nearby grasses. For this reason, it was once seen as an indicator of poor grassland by farmers, but is now often used to turn improved

grassland back to meadow; by feeding off the vigorous grasses, it eventually allows more delicate, traditional species to push their way through. Yellow-rattle is the foodplant for the larvae of two rare moths, including the grass rivulet.


There are currently 2 vacancies on the PC and details can be found on the website or via the clerk on parishclerk@sourtonpc.org.uk

Movie Watch - May 2025

Despite limited expectations, May became a good month for cinema visits.

It began in rewarding fashion when nothing more than a random spare evening led us to **The Amateur**, which sounded interesting but about which we knew nothing. Released in April, this turned out to be a terrific action thriller starring Rami Malek, last spotted sporting an uncomfortable-looking mouthful of prosthetic teeth for his compelling portrayal of Freddie Mercury in the Queen biopic, Bohemian Rhapsody.

On this occasion Malek plays Charlie Heller, a nerdish but brilliant CIA cryptographer whose wife Sarah leaves home on a business trip to London, only to be killed in a terrorist attack that goes horribly wrong.

A distraught Charlie is hopelessly ill-equipped to undertake such a mission but with no help forthcoming from the authorities, takes matters into his own hands as he seeks revenge for the senseless loss of his wife.

What follows is a convoluted but extremely watchable chase as Charlie, revealing hitherto unconsidered skills and depth of character, eventually tracks down Sarah's killers.

Malik, who also produced the film, gives an excellent performance in what we both found a thoroughly entertaining film. You've probably missed **The Amateur** at the cinema but it would be worth keeping an eye on the various movie channels. Recommended.

Towards the end of the month we joined a packed cinema to catch up with the long-awaited film adaptation of Raynor Winn's best-selling biographical drama, **The Salt Path.** The story will already be familiar to many, with the book having sold in excess of two million copies. It tells how married couple Raynor and Moth Winn, played by Gillian Anderson and Jason Isaacs, faced up to a series of overwhelming personal issues, including the loss of their home and a desperate medical prognosis delivered to Moth.

With no property or possessions of their own,

the couple choose to walk the South West Coast Path, leaving from Minehead before heading, without any certainty, towards Land's End and potentially beyond. Moth, hobbling painfully, is in no fit state to walk to the Post Office, let alone embark on what could develop into an epic 630-mile trek, but they set off and make agonisingly slow progress over demanding terrain.

The film was shot, mostly on and around the Coast Path, although apparently some Welsh venues were also used. I sat there, vainly trying to identify a series of stunning coastal locations but, apart from instantly recognisable glimpses of Lynton, Clovelly and, much later, Padstow, generally struggled. Hopefully you'll have more success.

The Salt Path is beautifully shot, superbly acted (both Anderson and Isaacs are excellent) and, despite some brutal weather, will do no harm to Cornish tourism, but ultimately we both found it slightly disappointing. I suspect the impact would be greater had we not read the book prior to seeing the film, but there were no surprises and the film faithfully followed incidents and characters outlined in the book.

Mostly it hangs together well, although a few issues jarred. These included an entirely unnecessary interlude in which Moth is mistaken for the Poet Laureate who happens to be touring Cornwall at the same time. More troublingly, we found the fact that both children effectively ignored their penniless parents, leaving them to their own devices, struggling desperately to survive.

I'm also unsure that the medical profession would endorse Moth's decision to cast aside his prescribed medication and instead rely purely on the benefits of walking and a minimal, deeply unhealthy, diet. But hey, it worked for Moth and he's still around, extolling the virtues and confounding the experts.

We saw an advance screening but **The Salt Path** arrived at The New Carlton on 30th May and should stay for a few weeks. You really should see the film and decide for yourselves.

overwhelmingly positive.

The next big title headed our way will be Mission: Impossible – The Final Reckoning in which Tom Cruise, not unlike Moth, continues to ignore medical advice and defy the aging process. This is the eighth film in the franchise with the title suggesting it will be the last. But then again the previous iteration was Mission: Impossible – Dead Reckoning Part One so who knows? By the way, Tom Cruise is 62.

There doesn't appear to be much of interest on the New Carlton's Coming Soon page until July, when we can expect **Jurassic World Rebirth** (the mixture as before, with Scarlett Johansson and Co), followed by the latest version of Superman, should you be that way inclined.

There were two major TV events during May with both taking place on the same day. **The Eurovision Song Contest** (BBC1) attracted an average audience of 6.7 million viewers, around 20% below the 2024 equivalent. Unfortunately the UK's entrant, Remember Monday, failed to trouble the judges to any great extent.

The peak TV audience to what became a thoroughly entertaining **FA Cup Final**, between Manchester City and Crystal Palace (BBC1 and ITV1), was around 6 million, but a combination of an afternoon kick-off and glorious weather will have suppressed the number of viewers.

We also spotted a few TV shows you may be interested in checking out. Or possibly not.

Phoebe Waller-Bridge was reported in 2019 to have been paid around \$20m a year by Amazon Prime in a 'Golden Handcuffs' writing deal, as they sought a follow-up to the outstanding Fleabag. Six years later she delivered their first dividend in the form of Octopus, a two-part documentary. It would be safe to say this was not what the people at Prime will have been anticipating.

The Anniversary (BBC1) is a mystery drama set on an island off the coast of Australia that looks worth watching.

The Four Seasons (Netflix) looks at what happens to three middle-aged couples and

long-standing friends, when one couple divorce.

Unforgotten: The Bradford City Fire (BBC2) is a well-made documentary telling the awful story, 40 years on, of the dreadful fire that claimed 56 lives.

The Assembly (ITV) features a neurodivergent panel interviewing a series of famous personalities, with no topics off-limit. Early subjects included Danny Dyer, Gary Lineker and David Tennant. Sounds unlikely but very highly recommended.

Oh and that's the last time Lineker will be mentioned on these pages!





In the summer of 1974 a heatwave blankets Boston and Mary Pat Fennessey is trying to stay one step ahead of the bill collectors. Mary Pat has lived her entire life in the housing projects of 'Southie', the Irish American enclave that stubbornly adheres to old tradition and stands proudly apart.

Dennis Lehane grew up in Boston. Since his first novel, A Drink Before the War, won the Shamus Award, he has published thirteen more novels that have been translated into more than 30 languages and become international bestsellers: Darkness, Take My Hand; Sacred; Gone, Baby, Gone; Prayers for Rain; Mystic River; Shutter Island; The Given Day; Moonlight Mile; Live by Night; World Gone By; Since We Fell, and Small Mercies.

Four of his novels – Live by Night, Mystic River, Gone, Baby, Gone, and Shutter Island - have been adapted into films. A fifth, The Drop, was adapted by Lehane himself into a film starring Tom Hardy, Noomi Rapace, and James Gandolfini in his final role. Lehane was a staff writer on the acclaimed HBO series, The Wire, and also worked as a writer-producer on HBO's Boardwalk Empire and the Netflix series, Bloodline. He was a writer-producer on the television adaptations of three Stephen King novels—Mr. Mercedes and End of Watch for DirecTV and The Outsider for HBO. He wrote and produced the acclaimed limited series Black Bird for Apple TV+ and is currently developing his next series for Apple.

21 June - The summer solstice

The Northern Hemisphere will mark the summer solstice on 21 June, the 'longest day of the year', when there will be around 16.5 hours of daylight.

The exact moment of the solstice is at 3.42 am BST, which is the point at which the Northern Hemisphere is tilted farthest towards the Sun. From here on out the days will get progressively shorter until the winter solstice on 21 December.

22 June - 350 years since King Charles II founded the Royal Observatory

In June 1675, King Charles II founded the Royal Observatory Greenwich. John Flamsteed's task as the first Astronomer Royal was to observe and record the positions of the stars in order to "find out the so-much-desired longitude of places".

This search for a way to measure longitude – a person's position east or west - led to the world's first Prime Meridian, laying the foundations for Greenwich Mean Time and the global time system we still use today.





I am very much enjoying the sunshine we're having, as I write this in May, but I am wondering how long we've got until it breaks. I'm sure the rain and wind will return soon, probably just in time for the May half-term holiday! The sunshine has made the wildflowers and new leaves of May really sing though, and it's been delightful.

You may have already seen online but a few lucky visitors spotted an otter while walking at the gorge at the end of April. In the video they shared with us the otter can be seen swimming and running about amongst some fallen moss-covered logs in the stream that flows over the waterfall, until it hears a visitor, then it dives underwater and swims away. They were also lucky enough to see it again, eating a fish on a rock. It's great to have confirmation that otters are around and using the river here.




