## **Victory in Europe**

May 8th has been known as V E Day for eighty years. When Germany finally surrendered it was not totally unexpected and the war against Japan still continued, but the relief was such that the countries connected to the Allied effort burst out into unbridled celebration. By chance I happened to be making my first visit to London on that day and can just about remember the hordes of people flocking from Trafalgar Square to Buckingham Palace, seeing Winston Churchill pass by on his way to the Palace and later appearing on the balcony with the King and Queen and the two princesses. Once the three Allied armies had crossed the Rhine on 22rd March the advance through Germany was sometimes met by little resistance or occasionally very hard fighting. On the eastern front the Russian forces were fast approaching Berlin. General Eisenhower, the Supreme Commander of the Allied armies had to redirect American forces to the south so that they did not encroach on land which had been previously agreed at the Yalta Conference would be managed by Russia at the end of the war. Instead, they swept through Bavaria and into Austria and met up with American troops who had been fighting the retreating Germans

Field Marshall Montgomery's 21st Army Group consisting of mainly British and Canadian troops had advanced through northern Germany and reached the Elbe by the end of April. With Berlin surrounded by Russian forces Hitler had taken his own life and named Grand Admiral Karl Donitz as his successor. He set up his short-lived cabinet at Flensburg near the Danish border. He was a committed Nazi and had been commander of the U Boat fleets until his promotion to Grand Admiral, but realised that defeat was inevitable and imminent.

He already knew from captured documents how Germany would be split into occupation zones and tried to bargain with the Western Allies in order to save thousands of troops from the Russian advance by letting them retreat west and surrender to American forces, but Eisenhower refused, partly because of arrangements made at Yalta but also because there were already thousands of surrendered prisoners of war, freed slave labourers and

displaced people to cope with. On 3rd May Donitz sent a delegation of high, ranking officers to Field Marshall Montgomery's headquarters near Luneburg in an effort to 'rescue' half a million troops of Army Group Vistula. Montgomery flatly refused because they were in the Russian zone and demanded the surrender of all German forces to his northern and western flanks which included all of North West Germany, the Netherlands and Denmark. Two members of the delegation went back to Donitz at Flensburg to seek his approval. They returned to Montgomery's headquarters the next day and were ushered into a carpeted tent and accepted the terms for surrender of the German army in North West Europe to start at 0800 hours on Saturday 5th May. The document was signed at 1830 hours by Montgomery on behalf of the Allies and five German officers for Donitz's cabinet. On 6th May another delegation visited the Supreme Headquarters, Allied Expeditionary Force (SHAEF) at Reims and offered to surrender all German forces to the Western Allies. General Eisenhower, the Supreme Allied Commander again refused and demanded unconditional surrender to all the Allies on all fronts. At 0241 hours on 7th May General Alfred Jodl, Chief of Staff of the German Army signed the surrender document. Walter Bedell Smith signed on behalf of Eisenhower in the presence of a representative of the Soviet High Command and witnessed by an officer of the French army. The Soviets wanted a Military Surrender to be signed in Berlin and this was completed the following day.

On Saturday 26th April the volunteers divided into two groups. One party helped with St Bridget's clean up day whilst the other continued with the clearing and widening of the footpath that runs in front of the village hall up to the Trescote Way turning..

The May meeting will be on **Saturday 31st** at the usual assembly time, 9.30am, at the cemetery gates. New faces are always welcome.

The blossom on the fruit trees in the community orchard is lovely at the moment so do find a minute to drop in to admire it. The orchard is tended by a conscientious band of volunteers and they plan to mow the grass every 2-3 weeks.

#### **Bridestowe Parish Council**

Bridestowe Parish Council met on Wednesday 23rd April at 7.30pm for two meetings. First of all came the Annual Parish Meeting - an opportunity for parishioners to ask questions or express concerns related to the parish. The Chair also delivers an annual report which had been circulated to councillors before the meeting.

Attendees were spared this with Alison Young giving only a synopsis as the report appears in BaSE for all to read.

This meeting was followed by a full PC meeting. and the main purpose was to discuss Bakers Estates' planning application for the land adjacent to the Cemetery.

#### 0783/25/FUL

Residential development of 30 dwellings, the formation of access, public open space and associated works.

There were not as many members of the public in attendance as expected. Householders, some of whom will be directly impacted by the development expressed strong objections to the proposed development. Nicole Stacey and Mark Edwards from Baker's Estates attended with the purpose of addressing these concerns. After a discussion period councillors voted and a split decision. The Chair did not cast a deciding vote as was her right. The outcome will be forwarded to WDBC with a response explaining the PC's neutral position. This response will appear on the PC's web page of the Bridestowe website.

The PC will meet again on Monday 19th May. This will be the **Annual Parish Council Meeting** and will include the election of a new Chair.

### Chair's Annual Report April 2025

As I write this report I am mindful that the parish council will be meeting on April 23rd to discuss the full application from Bakers Estates for a mixed housing development of 30 units on the land adjacent to the cemetery. This site was allocated for up to 35 new homes in the Bridestowe & Sourton Neighbourhood Development Plan.

This is a landmark moment and the council will listen closely to the views of members of the public. Bakers Estates engaged with the council and the community in mid-October 2024 displaying the emerging layouts and inviting feedback and in March another public consultation was held.

On the subject of housing development, it is worth noting that Leander Development's appeal against the refusal decision by West Devon Borough Council has been unsuccessful.

To more mundane matters: the precept - the tax that parish councils charge their local electors to meet their budget requirements - was raised in line with the inflation rate as the council felt it prudent to do so, bearing in mind the rising costs of services.

The council continues to maintain the churchyard, cemetery and Sporting Green. The recent collapse of a section of the church wall near the entrance to the Sporting Green, means the council faces a hefty bill to have it repaired.

Grass cutting is a major outlay but the contractor offers an excellent service. Attempts to reduce the number of cuts as a money-saving tactic proved counter productive as the overlong grass gave rise to problems of clumping. A return to the previous number of cuts has been agreed. The council's finances are audited both internally and externally. The external audit can be viewed on the Bridestowe website.

A year ago we appointed a new clerk to the council and Kayleigh Walker has proved to be a great asset, both efficient and conscientious. She tries to ensure that the council follows policy and

procedures, data protection and financial regulations. Relevant documents that demonstrate this can also be found on the website.

A safety check by ROSPA of the Sporting Green play equipment is carried out annually as well as weekly checks by volunteer Gerald Tickner, who reports any issues to the council. The council recognises that the lack of regular maintenance of the play equipment has resulted in it looking worse for wear. Some issues can be addressed but the fissured surface under the multiplay needs replacing and the council hopes to progress the project to replace the play equipment entirely.

There is strong feeling in the community that there should be a bus service that serves the community better, with buses actually calling in at the village centre. The council has contacted two bus companies and Devon County Council. Dave Ovenden, Senior Transport Co-ordinating Officer did reply at length and did say that when the 118 service's timetable is revised, there *might* be the possibility of a diversion into the village; that seems a long way off.

The council has been asked by a number of parishioners for allotments. The council did appeal to local landowners hoping that a parcel of land could be purchased but so far without success,

The council awarded a grant to the Bridestowe Scout Group and to the Volunteer Group who spent the money purchasing wild flower plugs, now planted at the entrance to the village.

The council received a grant to fund a 'Warm Spaces' event. This took the form of a midday soup lunch in March providing an opportunity for people to socialise in The Ark. It was an enjoyable get-together and will be repeated again in the winter months.

The long standing problem of water streaming down Station Road at Bridhayes persists. When temperatures drop this becomes a sheet of ice. In January 24 extensive work that lasted for several days was carried out by

Devon Highways but failed to rectify the problem. The council is pursuing this again; a solution must be found before there is a serious accident.

The council continues to provide sand and sacks for flood defence and the sand is stored in a large, black plastic storage bin in the White Hart car park with the kind permission of Mike and Sarah. Although there is no formal flood response team, the council is confident people most affected are well prepared. General advice and contact details for flooding and other possible emergencies is given in the Emergency Plan on the Bridestowe website and this is in the process of being updated. The council is very grateful to the many volunteers from the community who are always there to lend a hand to keep the village looking spruce either by carrying out general tidying tasks or by waging war on litter. My thanks to fellow councillors for their contribution and for their support and advice.

Marilyn is a retired Police Officer having served in Devon & Cornwall Constabulary for over 30 years, completing her service as a Traffic Inspector in Exeter.





Last year we had perfect weather although we saw and/or heard fewer species than usual - one unusual sighting turned out to be the Red Devils Army display team of powered parachutists descending through trails of red smoke to herald the start of the Ten Tors walk! So far this year summer arrivals have included chiffchaff (first heard 8 March), swallow (first seen 2 April), blackcap (first heard 4 April) and willow warbler (first heard 6 April) – although not record earliest dates in my database these are all earlier than the average dates.

## Friends of St Bridget's yearly report

The FOSB committee has benefited this year from some new faces and their energy has been invaluable. The preservation of the fabric of the building of St Bridget's is the sole reason the friends was formed in January 2013. There is no financial support from the diocese for repairs.

Whilst some on the committee are also part of the PCC, many have no affiliation with any religious organisation but wish to help preserve the church building in the centre of our village. Although the regular congregation is small, many in the village use the building. Apart from baptisms, weddings and funerals, the school holds events in the church and seasonal celebrations fill the church regularly. None of the money raised by FOSB is used for day-to-day costs of running the church but all money, time and effort is for the support of the building which has suffered from ongoing deterioration and, in retrospect, some unwise repairs- well-meant at the time - undertaken in the sixties which are now causing structural problems.

Over the last year several activities have been undertaken. Clean up days regularly help to keep the churchyard tidy, and the 'Support a Grave' initiative has improved the graveyard. This is an ongoing project for the volunteers interested in helping out but not always available for a clean up day. Thank you to all the volunteers who've been involved in both the regular clean ups and taken responsibility for a grave.

A 'To do' list of projects that can be managed and executed by volunteers has been produced and updated as tasks are completed.

The very successful photo competition raised interest in the village (and some money) and it will be repeated this summer.

FOSB engaged in the Christmas tree festival, which was a glorious event, and many thanks to the organisers.

The current projects include the resurrection of the yearly plant sale – this will be held in the village hall in conjunction with Bacon Baps on

24 May. Please come along and support the return of this popular event.

We would like to thank those involved in the running and organising of all the fund raising events.


The most recent Quinquennial inspection report identified a number of areas that required attention. Some more urgent than others but the prime concern is the tower. Water leaking through the walls is causing ongoing problems in the tower itself and also the body of the church. Clearly this is not a DIY project, or even one that could be undertaken using the FOSB funds. A subcommittee has been formed to set out a list of works required in the tower, organise quotes for the work, apply to grant organisations and permission from the diocese to proceed. Hopefully resulting in significant repairs and the solution of the problem with the damp. Sadly, there is no money from the diocese, but their permission (with a significant financial cost) is required. The subcommittee is grateful to the diocese surveyor who has offered to give a free opinion as to what will need to be done and a suitable date for this is awaited. It is hoped that the current funds available in the FOSB accounts will support the preliminary costs and possibly allow some match funding.

Further discussion will need to clarify where the friends are placed with regard to the PCC following a directive from the diocese, and this will need to be raised with the members at the AGM in lune.

More support is always welcome – to be a member costs £6 a year. The huge value of having members is that the more members there are, the clearer it is that the church building is important to the village. This will be a question asked by many grant agencies who will not wish to contribute money to a building that is not.

### **Movie Watch - April 2025**

As I write, we're faced with the customary Easter Holiday ragbag of titles at the New Carlton.

There's 'an endearing Oscar-winning animation' about a cat whose home gets washed away (Flow), playing alongside Minecraft, 'where creativity doesn't just help you craft, it's essential to one's survival.' No, sorry, not a clue.

Meanwhile Disney invites us all to 'return to where the magic began' with a live action reimagining of their 1937 animated classic, **Snow White**. Reimagining? Is that a word?

The first interesting title on the schedule is **The Penguin Lessons**, starring Steve Coogan and Jonathan Pryce. 'A well-meaning, awkward tonal jumble of a movie, based on the best-selling memoir by former teacher Tom Michell,' the Guardian reviewers weren't overly impressed.

Coogan plays Tom, who takes a job in Peronist Argentina in 1976, teaching English at a stuffy private school for the sons of wealthy expats, where he becomes increasingly wary of the overbearing headteacher, played by Pryce.

On a holiday to Uruguay, Tom rescues a penguin from an oil slick on the beach and finds himself responsible for the bedraggled bird. He ends up smuggling it back to Argentina with him. **The Penguin Lessons** was released on 18th April and should run in Okehampton for a few weeks.

Later in April we'll get a chance see the latest **Star Wars** film, **Episode III – Revenge of the Sith**. Spell-check wasn't keen but that is correct. If you're a fan of the franchise, you'll know just what to expect. Hayden Christensen, Ewan McGregor and Natalie Portman star in what will doubtless be a heavily promoted title.

**The Accountant 2** sounds like it should be worth a check. Christian Wolff has a talent for solving complex problems. When an old acquaintance is murdered, leaving behind a

cryptic message to 'find the accountant,' Wolff is compelled to solve the case. Ben Affleck stars in a well-reviewed thriller.

If given a chance, we're also keen to see **Mr Burton**, which stars Toby Jones and Lesley Manville in a biographical drama about the early life of the great Welsh actor. It tells the story of how the poor son of a miner became one of the world's greatest performers. Mr Burton (coincidentally also the name of his drama teacher) was released in early-April to celebrate what would have been Richard Burton's 100th birthday.

I pointed out **Mission: Impossible – The Final Reckoning** last month. Nothing much to add, other than a confirmed launch date of 21st May. Tom Cruise stars as Ethan Hunt in what will inevitably be one of the big films of the summer.

Finally, we mentioned **The Salt Path** last month and that also has a confirmed launch date, Friday 30th May. A combination of local interest, a compelling storyline and plenty of publicity is likely to mean this will also require advance booking at the New Carlton. As ever, I should keep an eye on the cinema website.

On the smaller screen, we were looking forward to Neil and Martin's Bon Voyage (U&Gold) in which Martin Clunes and Neil Morrissey revisited their laddish relationship in the original 1990's Men Behaving Badly sitcom. Following the success of Paul Whitehouse and Bob Mortimer in their BBC 'Gone Fishing' delightful series. commissioners seem to think all you need do is pair a couple of likeable 60-something blokes and you're onto a winner.

This disappointing show demonstrates that programme making is not that simple. They were based at Morrissey's lovely French holiday home where they......well, just pottered about really. The joy of **Gone Fishing** lies in the relationship between the two characters, but that is underpinned by their shared love of fishing and wherever that takes them. Sadly this shapeless affair had no such purpose.

We were also looking forward to **Your Friends and Neighbours** (Apple TV+) and this one duly delivered. It features the painfully cool Jon Hamm as Andrew Cooper, a hedge-fund manager in what, to my knowledge, is Hamm's first major role since his portrayal of Don Draper in the superb **Mad Men**. Recommended.

**The Piano** (C4) returns for a third series and, once again, it's a tear-jerking delight. Amateur pianists turn up at Liverpool Street Station and play for commuters. Clearly there's more to it than that, but basically it's an amateur talent contest, purely for pianists. Entrants include a 12-year-old girl who taught herself to play during lockdown, a 77-year-old music hall performer and a thwarted Britpop star. Heartwarming stuff.

Possibly the most interesting show to be screened during April was **Last One Laughing** (C4). This was classic old-school Channel 4, for those who remember the station's controversial early days under Michael Grade (C4 launched in 1982, to save you looking).

Last One Laughing was hosted by Jimmy Carr and featured ten comedians filmed whilst held captive in a room for six hours. The only rule was that they mustn't laugh. Easier said than done, given that inmates included the likes of Joe Wilkinson, Rob Beckett, Daisy May Cooper and, worst of all if you're trying to suppress laughter, Richard Ayoade and Bob Mortimer. Some will love it, some will sit stony-faced throughout, but either way, track it down on the C4 catch-up service and see what you think. Just remember to keep a straight face.

This City is Own (highly rated BBC1 arises)

**This City is Ours** (highly-rated BBC1 crime drama)

Volcano with Dara O'Briain (starting with

Mount Etna, on C5)

**Black Mirror** (contemporary reworking of The Twight Zone, Netflix)

**The Studio** (American satirical comedy series, Apple TV+)

**Death in Paradise** (5.8m, BBC1) and **Britain's Got Talent** (5.4m, ITV) topped the ratings for the first week of April, but a special mention for Rory McIlroy's gripping performance in Augusta. BARB reported a remarkable peak Sky audience of 1.85m just before midnight.

### Stamper's Wood at Phare's

People have asked me what is going on in our field – it can be seen from Bridestowe and has lots of green sticks – horse jumps?

This is the embryonic wood planted by volunteers organised by the charity, Moor Trees, and grant funded. These volunteers normally bring their own lunch but we chose to provide lunch – seemed the least we could do.

Around 4,862 trees have been planted. The provenance of all the trees is Devon, mainly grown in the Moor Trees nursery, also largely looked after by volunteers.

The trees are indigenous and include: oak, birch, blackthorn, hawthorn, rowan, Wych elm, crab apple, hazel, alder buckthorn, hornbeam, spindle, wild cherry, guelder rose and field maple. Oak is 20 per cent and the proportion reduces down to two per cent for field maple. Beech was not included as not local to this area, which we find odd but I suspect it will soon self set. No ash or elm due to disease.

The green shelters you can see are plant based and will be absorbed back into the soil – perhaps sooner than intended. Each tree has a woolly blanket held down by five bamboo pegs. Putting these bits on took as long as planting the trees.

Dino put up a deer fence all around the field, all funded by the grant. It will be fascinating to see it grown even though, as maturity will be at least 100 years hence, we may not see it in its full splendour...

We hope to have an annual event each spring with the volunteers to celebrate and mark how the wood develops.

Our field was planted as part of the Plymouth and South Hams Community Forest (yes, weird we know). The planting is part of the intent to meet 30 x 30 target for the UK. "The "30x30" target refers to the UK's commitment to protecting 30% of land and sea by 2030, as part of the global 30x30 initiative. This includes efforts to increase woodland cover and restore or create wildlife-rich habitats."

# News from Lydford Gorge National Trust Rose Cooke, Visitor Experience Officer

May is one of my favourite times of year in the gorge, the bluebells are at their peak and there are lots of other wild flowers, the trees have their leaves but they are still that bright green of spring, and the birds are singing and flowing water can be heard all around.

Ranger Luke heard the first pied flycatcher (photo) on Monday 14 April so hopefully these summer visitors will now be busy making nests and laying their gorgeous blue



eggs. The rangers will be surveying the nest boxes again this year to add to the data they have been collecting for the past few years. They have also started to survey reptiles in the orchard. There are six corrugated iron sheets on the ground, spaced around the orchard. They provide a perfect place for cold-blooded reptiles as they retain heat, providing a warm place for them to bask and shelter from predators. So far only slow worms have been spotted, but these legless lizards are still fascinating.

You may have spotted some rather ragged looking tree work around the waterfall trail. Over winter a team of tree surgeons were working to improve the diversity of habitat in the woods. Part of this work was veteranising chosen trees. Veteranisation is a technique where younger trees are deliberately damaged in a way that mimics natural processes to help create varied habitats for wildlife.

The extension to Tucker's Pool is back open after the busy Easter holidays. Due to the very narrow paths here, and the two-way traffic, we'll again be asking visitors not to walk dogs along this route. Please help us to keep everyone safe if you want to explore this beautiful section of the gorge.
