#### The Vicar writes...

#### **Letter From America**

The church encourages its parish priests to meet up with colleagues in what are known as chapter meetings. The idea is to catch up with happenings in the wider church and prevent us from becoming too isolated. Now and then we even connect with fellow churchmen from outside of Devon.

This letter from an American author and priest, under the heading: 'Questions for the Church of England' – 'The Cost of Moral Cowardice', made me realise how different life can be beyond the shire and to appreciate the type of issues some of my colleagues are faced with. It also poses a question for all of us. Spare a thought for those who aren't lucky enough to live in our peaceful part of the world.

#### Delaware. Wednesday, July 16, 2025

The greatest scandal in modern British history is the cover-up of the Northern grooming gangs' activities for over twenty years. The victims were young white British girls, many as young as 10, who faced ordeals so harrowing I cannot describe them here (......)

This great evil was then superseded by an even greater one: the cover-up of the crimes by British society at all levels. When the rapes were reported to the police, social services, MPs and the media, all turned a blind eye, and in some cases blamed the young girls themselves for what had happened. The reason? They were all afraid of being labelled "racist."

Eventually, due to the industrial scale of the rapes - thousands of girls were victims - it was no longer possible to suppress or ignore the story. A few brave reporters took up the girls' case and the truth, at last, became widely known.

Members of some of the gangs were arrested, tried and sent to prison. Last month, the British Home Secretary Yvette Cooper shared the summary findings of the report on grooming gangs by Baroness Casey. The report makes chilling reading. The government has since

Where was the Church of England when all of this was going on? Sadly, the Church joined in the conspiracy of silence. Last month, the Bishop of Blackburn, Philip North, wrote an article for the Church of England Newspaper, in which he asked why the leaders of the Church had not spoken out earlier.

ordered a national enquiry.

In his article, Bishop North writes, "I have heard directly and on many occasions of the anxiety of

working class families that their daughters are vulnerable to well organised gangs. Why did I so readily believe the voices that claimed that calling for an inquiry was a collusion with the far right?"

The bishop admits that agreeing with anyone on the "far right" carries a far greater stigma than failing to protect young children from sexual abuse. This is evidence of serious moral confusion. While he is proud of the Church's commitment to fostering close relationships with Muslim communities, his fear of offending his Muslim brothers and sisters closed his ears to the cry of the victims. "Raising an issue that so directly impacts one ethnic group could appear to sit ill with our commitment to racial justice," he writes.

Underlying this meek observation is the modern notion of the unquestionable good of multiculturalism. Unfortunately, it overlooks what happens when large numbers of immigrants settle in a country whose cultural values and assumptions are very different from their own. The gangs were clearly operating on racist principles, but no one had the courage to call them out. To do so would mean attacking the entrenched narrative that all Muslims are potential "victims" of racial injustice. By failing to identify the true victims, society condemned the girls to their fates.

The bishop concludes his article with these words: "I am doing some serious reflection about my fear-driven silence when it comes to grooming gangs. I hope other church leaders will do the same." What is missing from the bishop's article is a sense of righteous anger. He talks only of "working class neighborhoods." Depersonalizing the problem - discussing it in classist terms, along with "benefits dependency, asylum seekers and energy costs" - minimizing the gravity of these horrific crimes and the failure of the Church to witness to them.

Sadly, so many leaders in the Church resemble the priest and Levite in the parable of the Good Samaritan who, seeing the beaten body on the road, pass by on the other side. In this matter, the Church of England has exchanged the God of love and compassion for the god of "social cohesion." Could the Church as a whole repent of its failure to stand up for its most vulnerable members in their hour of need? The bishop has made a start. The Church now needs the courage to admit its mistakes and seek forgiveness. Father David Beresford



## The Three R's by Howard Barkell

From roughly the middle of the nineteenth century politicians began to accept that it would be better to educate young children rather than send them out to work at an early age. Before that education had been a matter of luck, did you happen to live in a place where one of the churches had been enlightened enough to build a school and were your parents willing or able to send you. Anglicans, Catholics and Nonconformists all ran schools financed by their denomination.

When the matter was debated in Parliament there were those who thought all Voluntary schools, i.e. those financed by religious organisations, should be abolished as their opponents suggested they were guilty of their own form of indoctrination, others maintained they were already serving a useful purpose and should be retained. When the Elementary Education Act was passed in 1870 it decreed that Voluntary schools should continue unchanged, but local Boards could build and maintain elementary schools where there were none. They would be funded by local rates and would concentrate on teaching the three r's Reading, 'Riting and 'Rithmetic. A fourth might be added to those as Religious Knowledge could be taught, but it was to be nondenominational.

By 1870 there had already been a school at Bridestowe for some time. The core of the present building dates from 1862, so the sign on the cloakroom told us. There has never been a day school at Sourton, although the idea has often been put forward. The reply has always been that there have never been enough children to warrant a school in both villages, even though children from Sourton had to walk all the way to Bridestowe. At Lydford a Board was set up to build and run an Elementary School. Although it would be nondenominational the Rector, the Rev. Fuller, who at the time was living at Princetown, managed to be elected chairman of the Board and the Curate, the Rev. Chafy-Chafy, had a big say in the siting of the school. In October 1875 the Board was inviting tenders for building the new school and the following month the contract was awarded to Messrs. Blatchford and Sons of Tavistock. The only snag was that

the proposed site somewhere near the church and castle had been rejected as being unsuitable. It wasn't until the following August that the Board agreed to purchase a quarter acre of Higher Park Meadow from Mr. Edmund Powell. In November 1877 the contractors hoped that the roof would soon be completed. In May 1878 William Kenner was appointed as the first Head Teacher. His salary was to be £90 per annum. The opening of the school building was arranged for July 1st. Various alterations and additions have been made since then to keep the building fit for purpose. Bridestowe School has survived some traumatic moments, not least in 1972, when a runaway lorry loaded with potatoes heading for Cornwall crashed through the playground wall and into the school building. Fortunately the accident happened in the early morning when the school was empty, sadly the driver was killed. The result was that the school was closed, pupils eventually returning to temporary buildings in what had been the adjoining garden and the authorities were finally persuaded that Bridestowe really did need a bypass.

Although the original building may have been started in 1862 it didn't actually open until June 3rd the following year. It consisted of just the part that faces the road and was built to house 70 children. Designed by S. Hooper of Hatherleigh, who incidentally also designed the addition of the north aisle and vestry to St. Petroc's a few years later, it was built by the local firm of Lintern Brothers at a cost of about £450 excluding the purchase of the site. It was soon ascertained that the building was too small and in 1872 a new classroom was added to give the building its L shape.

It wasn't much different when I started there in the early nineteen forties. The infant room at the front had been made larger by removing an internal wall and the long room was divided into two by a sliding screen. Heating was provided by three solid fuel stoves during the winter. The infants sat at wooden tables and chairs, older children sat at double iron framed desks complete with holes for the china ink wells!

In 1880 an Act made it compulsory for children between 5 and 10 to attend school. In 1893 the age was increased to 11, in 1899 to 12, but not until 1918 to 14. It stayed thus

until 1944 when it was increased to 15 and separate secondary schools were introduced. Before that pupils stayed at the same elementary school until they were old enough to leave.

The increased numbers of children at school resulted in a shortage of trained teachers because teacher training was haphazard and mainly done at diocesan level. The monitor or pupil teacher system was widely used. Pupils that teachers thought suitable were encouraged to stay on until the age of 18 combining their own education with teaching younger children. Some then went on to train as teachers which originally would have been done locally, which is why most of the early head teachers here in Devon were trained at St. Luke's, Exeter. The title Asssistant Teacher often meant that person was unqualified, but was cheaper to employ. Village schools were often staffed by schoolmaster and his wife or sister helped by a couple pupil teachers. In 1902 local board schools were abolished and taken over by Local Education Authorities where experts in all aspects of education were available and problems could be promptly shared and solved. This was the case until the government of the day introduced the LMS (Local Management of Schools) scheme as part of the Education Reform Act of 1988 when each school was given its own pot of money, previously managed by the L.E.A., and left to spend it as they saw fit. What changes we have seen since then! Have they always been for the better? How many have managed to live up to that wonderful school trotted out on all those training days called Copingwell School?

#### **Bridestowe Volunteer Group** has

been busy. If volunteers are not picking up litter then they are clearing the gutters of weeds throughout the village.

The orchard needs regular upkeep and the grass is kept clear around the fruit trees. The group will meet again on **Saturday**, **30th August** at 9.30am, congregating at the cemetery gates. Then there's the option of retiring to the hall afterwards for well-earned refreshments.

## Help needed to upgrade the Play Equipment.

#### **Rural telephone services**

The parish council was sent an informative bulletin from David Boocock, Projects Officer, Conservation and Communities for Dartmoor National Park Authority in which he addresses the impact of the removal of public telephone kiosks in remote rural areas. Bridestowe's was disconnected a good few years ago and now serves as a well-used book exchange. However, as David points out, loss of a landline during power cuts can have serious consequences for some, particularly in rural areas who have poor mobile signal.

Here is an extract from his email:

As you know, many Public Call Boxes (PCBs) have been removed from many rural villages of Dartmoor. This is adding to the justified concerns of many residents who are worried about the new 'Digital Voice' telephone system that BT / EE are rolling out.

As a recap, 'Digital Voice' is a replacement to the landline phone service, and will only work using broadband. This means that in a power cut situation, the landline will not work – and in many areas with little or no mobile signal, this would cut off potentially entire villages. This is very serious as it could make emergency calls unavailable.

The other important information I found is regarding the Digital Voice switchover. Although they do not publicise it widely, there are criteria for getting the 'Digital Voice back-up battery' (normal cost £105) for free. They publicise it as 'Additional Needs', which as you would expect covers people over the age of 75, and people with certain disabilities, Telecare pendants etc. However, 'additional needs' also means 'landline dependent', so if you are in an area with little or no mobile signal, you can qualify as that. This means that if you are pre-registered with BT, you can get the battery back-up and have an engineer come to install it all for you for free. To register, you must call **0330 1234 150** - the webpage is this one **Here For You | Help for** customers with an impairment | BT Help If you are a BT phone customer and have access to the 'Openreach Portal', apparently you can register there too

#### **Movie Watch - August 2025**

Can't really start with anything other than **The Salt Path** this month. Or The Pinch of Salt Path as Caitlin Moran cruelly, but not unreasonably, retitled it in The Times.

Regardless of whether you read the book, saw the film or ignored all the fuss and did neither, you'll be aware of the subsequent furore surrounding Raynor Winn's nevertheless extremely readable memoir.

The book, which has sold two million copies, covers the supposedly true story of a couple (Raynor and Moth Winn) who decide to walk the SW Coast Path after losing their 'forever home' as a result of some calamitous financial dealings, closely followed by a potentially fatal medical prognosis delivered to Moth (an abbreviation of Timothy, which hadn't dawned on me).

Their story was made into a feature film starring Gillian Anderson and Jason Isaacs which we discussed here last month. The film was lovely to look at and generally decent enough, without being anything special.

However the veracity of their account was cast into considerable doubt when The Observer broke a story claiming serious inconsistencies in the book, including the fact that the couple actually lost their home after Winn had allegedly defrauded her employer of £64,000. The newspaper also revealed that while the couple were supposedly homeless, they actually owned a property in France

Regardless of the strength and validity of the allegations, some supporting charities immediately cut ties with the couple, while some bookshops have already offered refunds for pre-publication orders of Winn's next book, On Winter Hill, scheduled for release in October.

It's tricky to pinpoint exactly where the responsibility lies, but when an author signs a contract with a publisher, there are usually covenants that include clauses about the truthfulness and integrity of the material, to

the best of the author's knowledge and belief. The publisher is then entitled to cancel that author's contract, should a book's legitimacy be called into question.

I suspect this story will run and run, probably considerably longer than the film.

As I write, the big titles showing in Okehampton are **Jurassic World Rebirth** and **Superman**. The cast of the former is led by Scarlett Johansson who stars in 'an action-packed new chapter which sees an intrepid team racing to secure DNA samples from the three most colossal creatures, across land, sea, and air.'

My devotion to the BaSE readership stops short of actually going to see films like this. However proper critics suggest it suffers from 'a weak story, forgettable villains and a messy narrative, but is saved thanks to great visuals, fun action, good performances and nice nostalgia.' As ever, the choice is entirely yours.

Meanwhile the latest iteration of **Superman** sees director James Gunn take on the original superhero in a newly imagined DC universe, with a blend of epic action, humour and heart, delivering a hero driven by compassion and an inherent belief in the goodness of humankind.

When Superman gets drawn into conflicts at home and abroad, his actions are questioned, giving tech billionaire Lex Luthor the opportunity to get the Man of Steel out of the way for good. Will intrepid reporter Lois Lane and Superman's four-legged companion, Krypto, be able to help him before it's too late? Who knows?

Look, my task here is simply to tell you what's on at the cinema, in case you fancy an evening out. Normal service will hopefully resume in the autumn although, to be honest, I can't spot anything of particular note in the August releases. **The Roses** (Olivia Colman, Benedict Cumberbatch) is a modern

reimagining of The War of the Roses and certainly has a fine cast. That one should arrive here late in the month but June, July and August last year delivered nothing, so this year is merely following that pattern.

My scribbled television notes, on the other hand, show plenty of material that at least one of us has greatly enjoyed during July.

I'll get live sport out of the way early on, as I sense there's not huge support in the village but my word, these last two England v India **Test Matches** (Sky), at Headingley and Lord's, have made for compelling viewing. And with England now 2-1 ahead in the five-Test series, the final two games should be equally exciting.

The UEFA European Women's Football Championship (BBC, ITV) provided the usual highs and lows we endure whenever national teams are involved, while it's not my specialist subject but I gather an exciting British Grand Prix (Sky) delivered something of a surprise winner in Lando Norris. Then there was Wimbledon (BBC) and the Open Golf (Sky). A Great Summer of Sport, as the promotions suggested would be the case.

Last month I chose not to mention Series 4 of Clarkson's Farm, mostly as this is only currently shown on Amazon Prime which, with around 19m monthly UK viewers, enjoys less than universal reach. That's a great Clarkson shame as has created an outstanding TV series, entertaining and educational in roughly equal measures. In 2008 Clarkson purchased, and now actively runs, a 1000-acre farm in West Oxfordshire. One local sheep farmer suggested that Clarkson had done more for farming in one series than BBC's Countryfile had achieved in 30 years.

Clarkson has made celebrities of his coworkers, most notably the remarkable Kaleb Cooper who he appointed Farm Manager and who has subsequently toured the country with his one-man show. Cooper, still only 27, was recognised at the recent British Farming Awards. Hopefully Amazon might agree terms with one of the major broadcasters, enabling a wider audience to enjoy the show.

**Glastonbury** was extensively covered as usual by the BBC, although this year not without controversy. Rod Stewart, Pulp, Neil Young, Lewis Capaldi and Olivia Rodrigo were some of the high-profile performers but the most publicity (and not in a good way) was generated by an entirely avoidable antisemitism row, provoked by punk-rap duo Bob Vylan. In a statement, the BBC was forced to confirm there was 'no place for antisemitism' in its output, and that it was taking action to 'ensure proper accountability for those found to be responsible' for the broadcast. Not a good look for the BBC.

Recommendations include Attack on London: Hunting the 7/7 Bombers, an acclaimed four-part Netflix series, and three crime drama series all worthy of your attention, The Waterfront (Netflix), Shetland (BBC) and Bookish (U&Alibi).

#### News from Lydford Gorge National Trust Rose Cooke, Visitor Experience Officer



July brought a mixed bag of weather from extreme heat to some high winds, luckily we only had one dead tree fall down, from a neighbouring property, so the rangers could clear it in time to reopen as usual. The grass in the orchard is looking very dry in places so we'll be happy with a little rain too. The Lyd Link path will be staying open all year, however, the path to Tucker's Pool has now closed for summer. We plan to reopen it from Monday 8 September.

The bank below the picnic area, outside the Devil's Cauldron tea-room, has been a sea of colour this summer. There have been several different species appearing since the rangers cleared it and seeded it with a wildflower mix. Blue cornflowers have been most prolific, and the yellow rattle has done really well too, although most of that has now gone to seed. Beautiful pink corncockle has popped up now and again and a large clump of corn marigold took pride of place through July. There were also a couple of red poppies at the start of the season. We're already looking forward to seeing what appears next year.

We had three lovely work experience students with us for a week in July, and they got a taste of all the roles here at the gorge. They spent a day with me, I had unfortunately finished painting all my chalkboards ready for the summer trail so instead, after an induction and tour, we spent a couple of hours in the orchard searching for interesting wildlife to photograph

and film. Then they each had two days with the rangers, making and putting up some more dormouse nest boxes, and even going off site to help with fencing at Cadover Bridge. Their other two days were filled in Visitor Welcome and the tea-room. It's great to give these students a taste of working life, although it definitely makes me feel old!




